- How to bake our award winning cakes
- Improve your customer service skills
- How to complete kitchen porter duties such as pot washing

## Bakery



Our bakery offers you the opportunity to produce a range of baked goods in a commercial standard kitchen.

- The health and safety and food hygiene guidelines you are required to follow







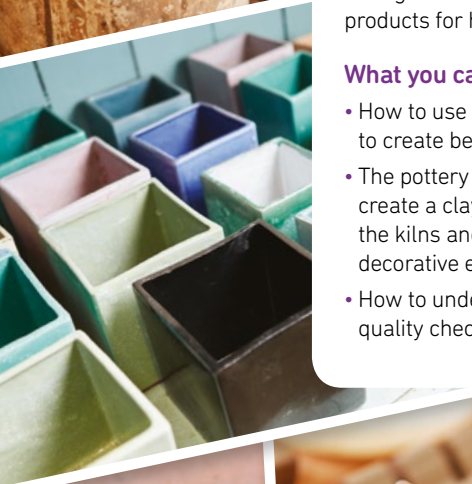
## Ceramics

## Contracting



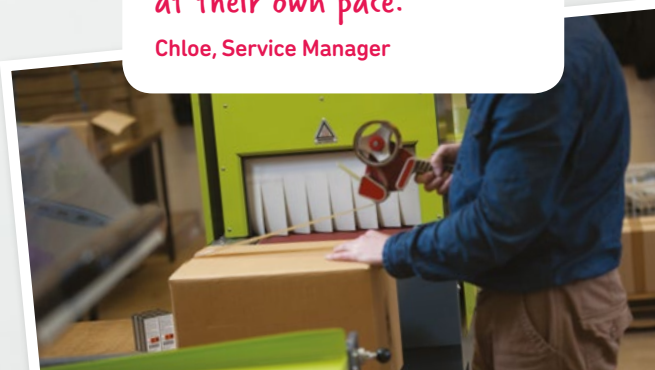
Our busy contracting workshop enables you to work as part of a team to complete contract packaging tasks for our local and national customers.
